

Enver HASANI, current President of the Constitutional Court of the Republic of Kosovo, was born on May 10, 1962 in Mitrovica. He is professor of International Law and International Relations. Professor Hasani has served as visiting lecturer in several universities in the region and USA, while in Winter Semester 2005 he stayed as a Fulbright Scholar the Center for International and Comparative Studies of the Northwestern University (Chicago, USA).

Law studies Professor Hasani completed at the University of Prishtina in 194 with an average grade 9.13 out of 10. First MA studies he continued in Prishtina in the filed of CIVIL LAW, while second ones in Ankara, Turkey, at the international English-speaking *University of Bilkent*, in the field of International Relations. At the same University and in the same field he completed his full PhD Studies.

From Novemebr 23, 1992 to October 1, 1997, proffessor Hasaniserved as a legal adviser with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Albania, accredited by the Government of Kosova in exile. In the capacity of the Government of Kosova in exile Professor Hasani served until May 11, 1999, when he resigned. At the same time, as an Albanian diplomat , Professor Hasani participated in scores of international conferences and other events organized under the auspices of UN, OSCE, Council of Europe , etc. In the abovementioned capacity Professor Hasani served last time in February-March 1999, in the Ramboiuillet Peace Conference on Kosovo (France).

Enver HASANI has been the founder of Department of Political Science and Public Administration (2001) of the University of Prishtina and served as its first Head to resign after six months following its establishment. At the same time, he founded the Human Rights Center of the University of Prishtina and served as its first Director for two years (December 2000 – October 2002. The Human Rights Center of the University of Prishtina was financially supported by international donors, most notably "FINNISH HUMAN RIGHTS PROJECT" and "WUS – AUSTRIA".

From August 2004 to April 2006, Professor Hasani served as the first Head of the Office for Foreign Relations of Kosova, a precursor to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kosovo.

In his professional capacity, Proffesor Hasani served as an adviser to Prime Ministers of Kosova Bajram Rexhepi, Ramush Haradinaj, Bajram Kosumi and Agim Çeku, without no political affiliation and loyalties.

Dean of the Faculty of Law of the University of Prishtina was elected in May 2006, a position to hold just few months due to his election as the Rector of the University of Prishtina on June 26, 2006. His mandated as a Rector of the University expired in June 2009, when he swore in as the Judge and later President of the Constitutional Court.

Professor Enver HASANI has so far published scores of academic articles in foreign scholarly journals , such as : "The Fletcher Forum of World

Affairs", "Perceptions", "EUROBALKANS", "Chicago Law Review", "Tomas Jefferson Law Journal", "Miskolc Journal of International Law". He has also published several books in English and Albanian languages. Thus, in Tirana, he published the book "The Dissolution of Yugoslavia and the Case of Kosovo: Legal and Political Aspects", under the auspices of the "Albanian Institute of International Studies" (AIIS: 1999), which is also published in Albanian language by the same Institute the same year.

This is the second edition of the book "Self-Determination, Territorial Integrity and International Stability: the Case of Yugoslavia", while the first one was published in Vienna in 2003 by the "National Defense Academy and Bureau for Security Policy , in co-operation with the PfP Consortium of Defense Academies and Security Studies Institutes" (Vienna 2003). This is his fifth book. The fourth one, published in 2009 in Albanian in Prishtina by "Design House", is in the field of Civil Procedure and is entitled "Ne Bis in Idem in Civil Procedure".

Enver HASANI is matted with Burbuqe Xhema and they have three children: Kastriot, Vatan and Dënesa. He speaks and writes fluently Albanian, Serbian and English, while has a solid working knowledge in French, Italian and Turkish.
